## COUNCIL MINUTES

June 14, 2011

### ST. JOHN'S CHAPEL UCC June 14, 2011, Council Minutes

#### Members present:

Dennis Gromer, Jim May, Steve Fortner, Shirley Datema, Curt Bartell, Jeanne Kruger, Elaine Tebbenkamp, Pastor Stephan Scharf, Pastor Becky Hebert

June 14 meeting was opened with prayer; May Council Minutes were approved via e-mail.

Motion was made and seconded to accept the May Council Minutes as approved via e-mail; motion approved.

#### Council Reports.

Vice President. There will be a Genealogy Workshop August 14 at 2 p.m. Possibly there will be an article in the newspaper about the workshop. Pastor Stephan Scharf has agreed to follow Pastor Becky's job description in her sabbatical absence.

Financial Secretary. Shirley Datema reported during the month of May, total offering was \$11,355.25 for an average weekly offering of \$2,271.05, showing a decrease from this time last year of \$806.75. Sunday School attendance has been down, but worship attendance was up by five from this time last year. Explanation of pass-throughs indicate that we are receiving some funds for mowing expenses, but are still in need of more. Other monies coming in were for Camp Aurora registrations, garden plots, OGHS, housekeeping and office supplies, United Ministries of Higher Learning, monies for postage in Sabbatical mailings, Haiti fund, and funds for pavers in the Labyrinth. Motion was made to accept the Financial Report as given; motion was seconded and approved.

Treasurer. Steve Fortner gave the treasurer's report for the month of May 2011, as follows: Total income for May was \$12,359.52 and total expenses were \$9,327.38 for a balanced net income of \$3,032.14.. A motion was made to accept the Treasurer's financial report;

motion was seconded; motion carried.

Board of Service Ministries. Elaine reported that the sign advertising garden plots for rent had been placed in the front of the Chapel. She also reported that the catered event for Pastor Becky's send-off on her Sabbatical experience was especially nice.

Board of Christian Education. Pastor Stephan reported that the weekend camping event at Camp Aurora in Windyville for St. John's Chapel congregation will be held June 24 through June 26. Some funds have been collected to go toward helping young campers at Camp Aurora's summer camp this year, but not enough to cover all the campers. Vacation Bible School will be August 1 through August 5.

Worship and Music. Curt Bartell reported that interviews are being conducted by the Choir Director Search Committee. More information will be given next month.

Library. No report.

Building/Grounds. Shirley Datema reported that there is still some inspection and work to be done because of the leaks in the north hallway ceiling and in the KIDS FIRST office. Dennis Gromer volunteered to cut into the south wall of the narthex to check the pipes that run to the outside hydrant, as there has been some water leaking in that area of the narthex as well. A big thanks goes to those who helped in removing items from the Youth's area in the garage. We had an appreciative group from Nebraska who were on a mission trip stay in the facility and joined us in our special Jazz worship service. They reported that they were quite impressed. A big "thank you" also goes to Dennis Gromer for cleaning the labyrinth. Shirley will be selecting a weekend for another work day to clean-up and spruce up around the Chapel and trim the hedges, etc.

Stewardship. The Stewardship Committee will be meeting September 21 to compose a letter to be sent out by September 29.

Department of Spirituality. No Report.

Visioning Committee. No report.

Pastor Becky's Report. Pastor Becky gave a promising report on the adoptive trial proceedings involving her daughter and adopted grandson Jonathan. She then reported on the recent Jazz worship service and that the majority of the congregation really enjoyed the change in routine and appreciated Cliff putting the spark back into worship. This group is the result of a conference artist in the residence program called "Creative Faith Project." Twelve churches will be selected to go through training, costing \$400, with an on-line discussion group and two free events. There are Lilly Endowment Grants available for innovative suggestions if someone was interested in writing a report and presenting it as a "Creative Faith Project." There would be four training sessions, two of which are free. We have resources from our own congregation that could be incorporated in this project. The pastor, worship committee, and the organist would go to the sessions. Curt Bartell offered \$400 to be used in the training if there is an interest in pursuing this project.

Our secretary Beth has asked that she come in 15 minutes earlier and leave 15 minutes earlier on Tuesdays so that she could attend a class for six weeks. Permission was given.

Pastor Becky wanted to thank everyone in providing such a wonderful "send-off" for her sabbatical. Conference Minister, Dale Parsons, will conduct worship services on June 16 and Martha Robertson will be here June 23.

Associate Pastor Stephan's Report. Pastor Stephan has just made application for the fall semester and classes at Eden, and he should hear from the deciding people in Germany by September as to whether or not they will accept the classes and experiences through Eden and serving at St. John's Chapel as sufficient preparation for his indoctrination into the ministry.

Pastor Stephan will be on vacation June 17 through July 3.

Old Business. Jim May reported that he is still working on the procedural policy for sexual misconduct and more will be discussed later.

Discussion was held on acquiring a line

of credit for a new parking lot.

Funds were collected and the receipt was submitted to our treasurer for reimbursement for Deb's going away gift.

New Business. Contact has been made with Habitat of Humanity in regard to building a house for Joplin residents. Building permits will start being issued in either August or September. We will need people to sign up as a work labor crew to participate. We discovered that the needed supplies for building one house are \$40,000. We may not be able to raise the full \$40,000, but we will apply for a \$2,000 UCC grant, and check with the UCC Conference to see if some of the funds coming in could be used to help pay for the building of our house. Habitat will assign a house to build whether we can raise the funds or not. Curt and Tona were looking at doing a fundraiser for the church with the money for Becky's Welcome Home party, and change that to a fundraiser for our Joplin Relief Project. Labor crews are forming all over the US, and we could ask if some of these crews would like to join with our crew in helping to build the house. There are two churches that wish to help us on this project, the new church started in West Plains and a church in Cedar Rapids, Michigan. We will contact these churches to see if they can hold fundraisers and keep them updated on where we are on securing a home to build.

We received a letter of suggestion from the Sabbatical Committee in regard to salaries "COVERING PASTORAL FUNCTIONS." Martha Robertson will receive \$5,000 and Pastor Stephan will receive \$2,700 plus a token of appreciation from any other savings realized during the sabbatical period. Motion was made to accept the salary recommendation from the Sabbatical Committee; motion was seconded and carried.

A gift was purchased for the new West Plains church in the amount of \$139.50. We have collected \$42 and need to place our needs in the bulletin and the Messenger for the remainder.

Council meeting ended with the reciting of the Lord's Prayer. Church opener for the month of July is Curt Bartell. The next Council meeting will be Tuesday, July 12.

Thank you for your gift to the United Church of Christ Japan Earthquake and Tsunami Relief fund. We recorded your gift of \$383.00 on 6/15/2011.

Our hearts ache for our sisters and brothers in Japan who have been impacted by the earthquake and tsunami which struck Northeast Japan on March 11. Even Japan, a developed country with among the most sophisticated disaster preparation and response systems in the world, needs the help of its world-wide neighbors in the wake of such a disaster.

The United Church of Christ is supporting the relief response of our partners the United Church of Christ in Japan (UCCJ) and Church World Service (CWS).

UCCJ has designated the Emmaus Center, Sendai, where Global Ministries missionary Jeffrey Mensendiek serves as youth director, as the Tohoku Disaster Relief Center. Distribution of relief materials and volunteer work teams is being coordinated through the Center.

CWS' supported assistance to some 25,000 individuals began on March 21 and will continue through September. Work focuses on:

- the distribution of requested relief items through 100 evacuation centers which include food, water, hygiene items, clothing and fuel.
- stationary clinics and mobile medical services in Natori, Iwanuma and Rikuzentakata cities.
- counseling services for pregnant women and women with young children to secure safe and private spaces for these women and children living in crowded evacuation sites.
